#### Azalea

Azaleas, part of the genus Rhododendron, are a favorite shrub of many gardeners for their spectacular blooms, with colors ranging from vivid orange to delicate yellow. The Azalea is prized for its glossy, dark green leaves that provide color and texture throughout the year. Spring to early summer is when the azaleas will bloom. Azaleas also attract various pollinators to your garden, including bees and hummingbirds, adding an element of wildlife interest to your landscape. Azaleas are known for their resilience, but they have specific growing preferences. They flourish in well-draining, slightly acidic soil, rich in organic matter. A layer of mulch, such as pine bark or pine straw, helps retain soil moisture and keeps azalea roots cool during the heat of summer. The USDA Hardiness zones are Zones 4-9. Azaleas prefer partial shade to full sun.

### Barberry

Barberry is a wonderful low hedge, barrier planting, or single shrub accent, with compact branches and deep crimson color to the dense foliage. This plant is also enhanced with bright red berries in fall and winter that attract winter songbirds to the garden. Barberry plants take full sun with moderate watering. It grows from 3 to 6 feet tall and 4 to 7 feet wide. USDA zones 4-9 The shrub is medium to very dense with many thorns. The leaves are bright green in summer, changing to orange, scarlet and reddish purple in the fall. Yellow flowers in spring are not very showy, because they are small and borne under the foliage, but the berries are bright red in the fall. Barberries prefer sun or partial shade. They are tolerant of most soil types and withstand dry conditions. They tolerate urban conditions better than many shrubs.

The upright, naturally cone-shaped habit makes it an excellent addition to your beautiful landscape. Boxwoods can also be used in great numbers to create a natural hedge on your property. Boxwoods will need full to partial sun with moderate watering. Boxwoods grow in USDA zones 4-9.

# Buckhorn

Buckthorn is a single stem or multi-stemmed shrub. The leaves of a buckhorn are simple, sub opposite; they are elliptical to ovate in shape with a weakly toothed edge. The Buckhorn leaves are featherly fernline green foliage. This plant can be planted to make a natural hedge also. This plant will take partial to full sun and can be grown in USDA Zones 3-7.

## **Butterfly Bush**

Butterfly bush is a shrub known for its colorful flowers and ability to attract a variety of beneficial insects. As the name implies, the shrub is particularly attractive to butterflies. This deciduous to semi-evergreen shrub typically grows from 6 to 10 feet tall by 4 to 10 feet wide with a rather open, arching form. Their stems are square in cross-section, and young shoots are covered by dense, white hairs. Leaves are opposite. 3 to 5 inches long by 1 to 3 inches wide, varying from deep green to gray-green to silvery-gray. The leaves of some cultivars are densely hairy underneath. Size, form and leaf color can vary widely by cultivar and should be considered when purchasing plants. The butterfly bush takes on full sun with moderate watering and can be planted in zones 5-10. This plant will bloom starting in the summer and end in the fall.

# **Crape Myrtle**

Crape myrtle is a shrub that many gardeners love for their beauty and low maintenance. The Crape Myrtle is known as the "Lilac of the South" for its blooming flowers and vibrant colors. It requires full sun and moist, well-drained soil, though it will tolerate occasionally wet or dry soil once established. Place it in a sheltered location protected from winter winds and mulch the soil to protect the roots. It resists deer, drought and pollution. Propagate it by seed or stem cutting. A rapid grower, common crape myrtle can reach 6 to 30 feet high and wide, depending upon the variety selected. Severe pruning or topping of the crape myrtle should not be needed to control the plant size. If pruning is required to thin the tree or shrub, it is best done in late winter or spring before growth begins. Common crape myrtle blooms from July to September with numerous and showy flowers. The flower color of the wild-type species is rose to red, but there are cultivars offering a variety of colors. The leaves are light green with tinges of red initially that become dark green by summer and colorful in the fall. Another highlight is its exfoliating bark. The crape myrtle takes full sun with moderate watering and can be planted in zones 7-10.

# Cypress

Cypress are evergreen trees that can reach up to 25 feet in height. The cypress tree has a very elongated conical or columnar shape, with a dense crown of branches near the trunk, or a pyramidal shape, with a lax crown and branches spread around the trunk. The cypress grows in zone 5-9 with full sun and moderate watering.

# **Eastern Red Cedar**

Eastern red-cedar is native to North America. These cold-hardy, adaptable evergreen trees serve many purposes in the landscape, especially in sites that are dry, alkaline or windy. The foliage of scale-like needles is attractive but prickly. In late summer and fall, many junipers have blue-green berry-like fruits, actually modified cones, that attract birds. Because they are quite salt-tolerant, they can be used near roads, driveways, and sidewalks. The Eastern Red Cedar is a fast growing tree that takes full sun with moderate watering. It can be grown in zones 3-9.

The green giant arborvitae is a large fast growing evergreen. Its natural pyramidal to conical form boasts dense, rich green foliage that darkens or bronzes slightly in the winter. This is an exceptional landscape tree for use as a screen, hedge or single specimen. This tree does best in a moist, full-sun location with light afternoon shade. It tolerates a wide range of soils. It grows in zones 5-8.

### Holly

The holly is a broad-leaf evergreen with a beautiful shape, but with a variety of insect and disease problems. The tree offers clusters of red berries that persist throughout fall and winter. The holly tree has Dark green, glossy and oval leaves. Younger plants have spiky leaves, but the leaves of older trees are much more likely to be smooth. Leaves in the upper parts of the tree are also likely to be smooth. The holly takes full sun with moderate watering. The holly can be grown in zones 5-9.

### Hydrangea

Hydrangea describes a number of deciduous, woody-stemmed shrubs with iconic clusters of flowers. The foliage comes in many shades of green, and varies in shape depending on the variety. Hydrangeas are best known for their clusters of four- or five-petal flowers that bloom late June into the fall. Color ranges greatly, red and pink to purple and blue, and some varieties come in white. Flower color will largely vary based on the composition of the soil it's planted in. Many times, flower color will vary from one side of the plant to another and occasionally, from one part of the bloom to another, resulting in beautiful multi-colored displays. Hydrangeas can be planted in zones 5-9 with moderate watering.

## Itea

The Itea Shrub has slender upright branches that eventually arch over; usually wider than tall. Very fragrant clusters of drooping creamy white flowers May-June. Dark green leaves turn scarlet and crimson in fall, remaining showy for many weeks. The itea will take full sun with moderate watering. The itea also can grow 3-5 feet tall and 4-6 feet wide.

### **Japanese Maple**

Japanese maple is a small deciduous tree or large shrub with a broadly spreading crown. The plant can be grown as a small single-stemmed tree or large multiple stemmed shrub. The habit is rounded to broad-rounded, with a layered branching structure similar to flowering dogwood. Trees typically grow 15 to 25 ft. Growth is slow to moderate, and the tree assumes a layered look with a low, dense, rounded top and spreading branches. The Japanese Maple will grow in zone 5-8 with moderate watering and full to partial sun exposure.

## Juniper

Common juniper is an evergreen conifer. The bark is grey-brown and peels with age. Its leaves are small and needle-like. Its berries are fleshy and aromatic. This shrub reaches up to 5 feet in height and 7-10 feet in diameter. This shrub can be grown in zones 3-9 with partial to full sun.

## Loropetalum

Loropetalum chinense, commonly called Chinese fringe flower, is white flowered broad leaved evergreen shrub. It typically grows in a rounded multi-stemmed form to 6-10' tall, but may over time rise to as much as 20' tall. Loropetalums are cold hardy in zones 7-10 and require minimal maintenance. Transplanting easily from containers, their preferred growing conditions include sun to partial shade (especially afternoon shade) and moist, well-drained, acidic soil with plenty of organic matter.

The flowers appear sporadically from May to July, but they have an intensely lemony scent with big, glossy green leaves. The magnolia can grow in zones 5-9 with full to partial sun with moderate watering.
